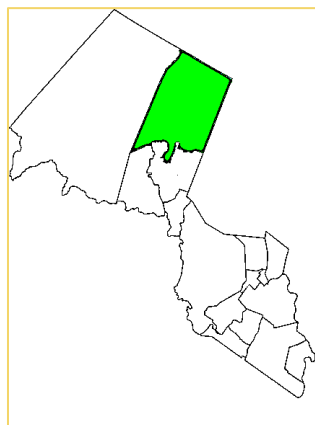

The Health Department accomplishes this by providing environmental stewardship, valuable health services, partnerships for health promotion, and emergency preparedness.



SERVICES

The Ringwood Health Department offers the services of a licensed health officer (HO), registered environmental health specialist (REHS), public health nurse supervisor and public health nurses (PHN), certified health education specialist (CHES), board-certified pediatrician (MD), certified municipal registrar (CMR), and animal control officer (ACO). Ringwood utilizes shared services agreements for some of the services provided to keep costs down.



BOARD OF HEALTH

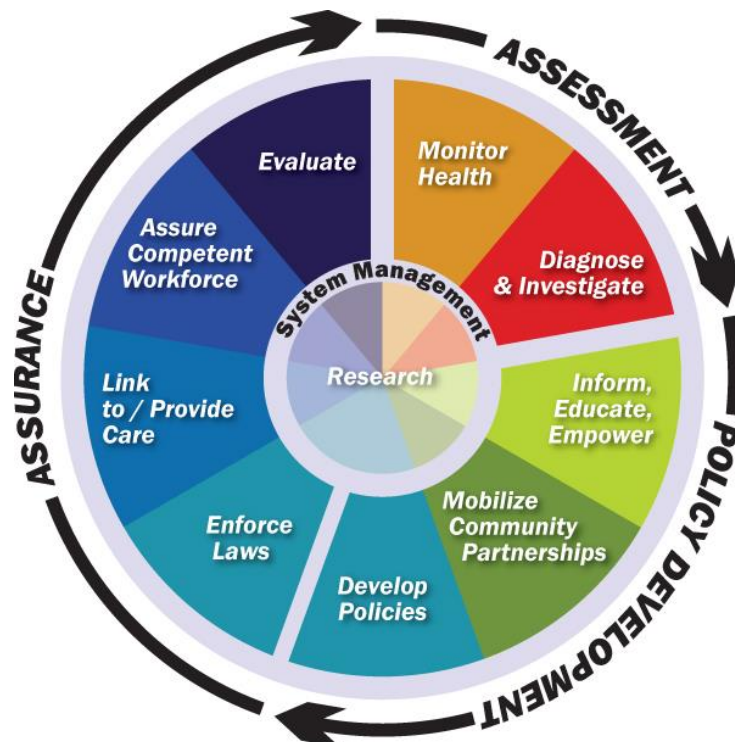

3. Inform, educate, and empower people about health issues.
4. Mobilize community partnerships and action to identify and solve health problems.
5. Develop policies and plans that support individual and community health efforts.
6. Enforce laws and regulations that protect health and ensure safety.
7. Link people to needed personal health services and assure the provision of health care when otherwise unavailable.
8. Assure competent public and personal health care workforce.
9. Evaluate effectiveness, accessibility, and quality of personal and population-based health services.
10. Research new insights and innovative solutions to health problems.

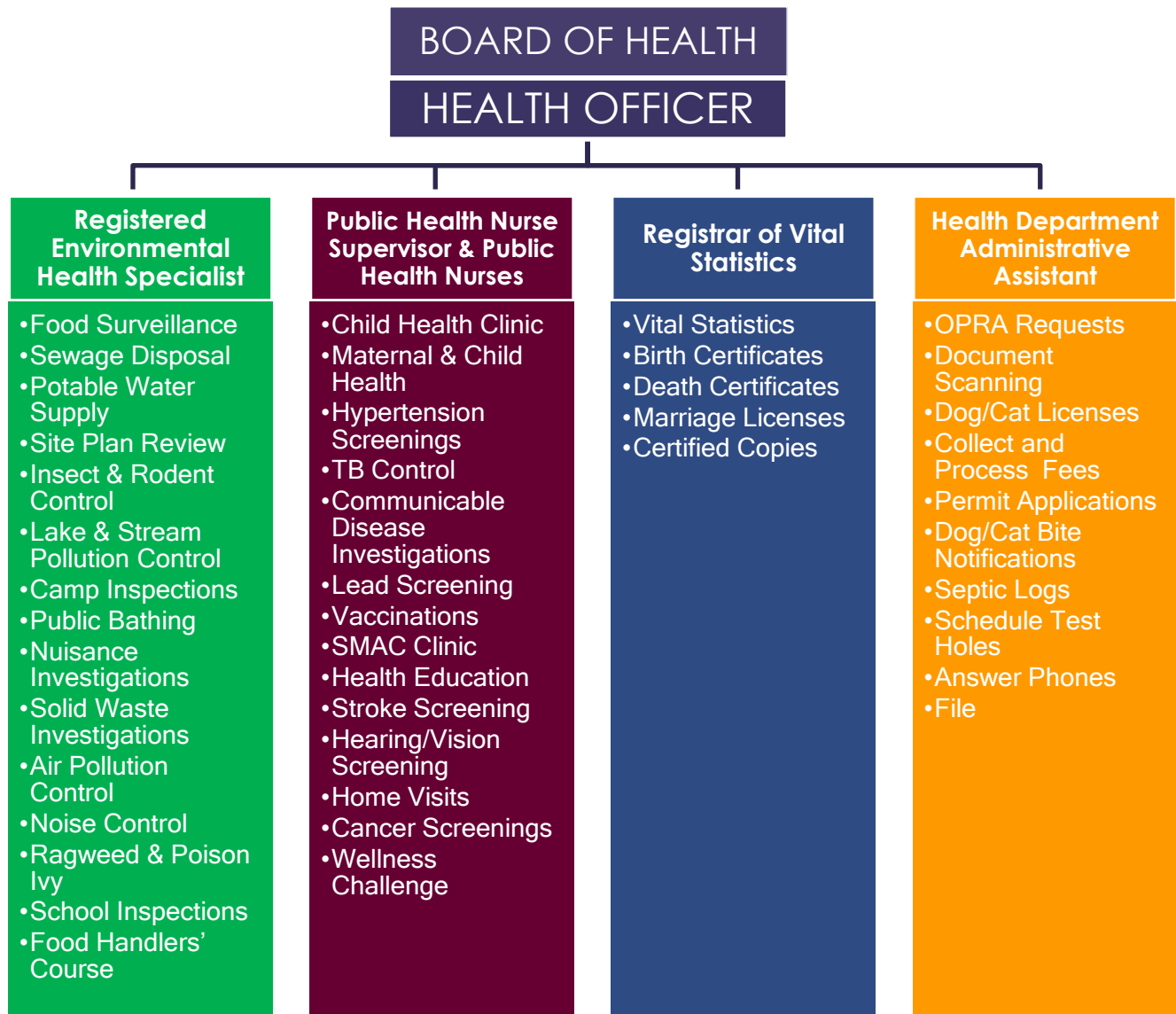

SARS-CoV-2 Pandemic and Mitigation Efforts

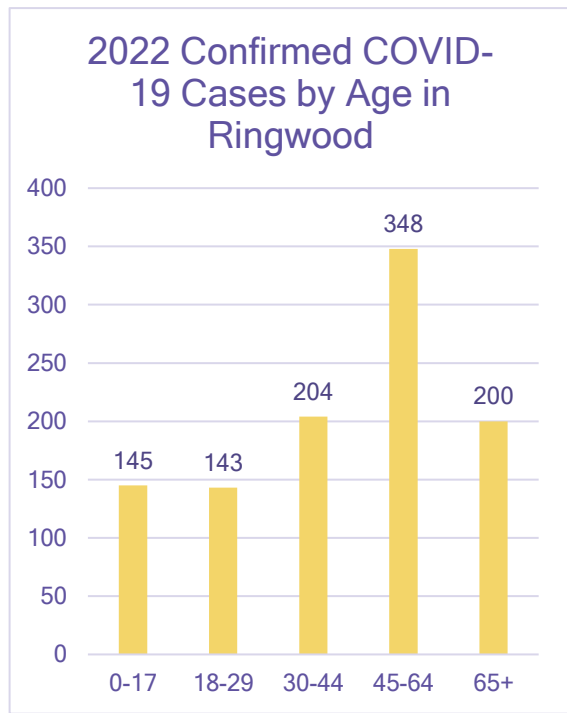
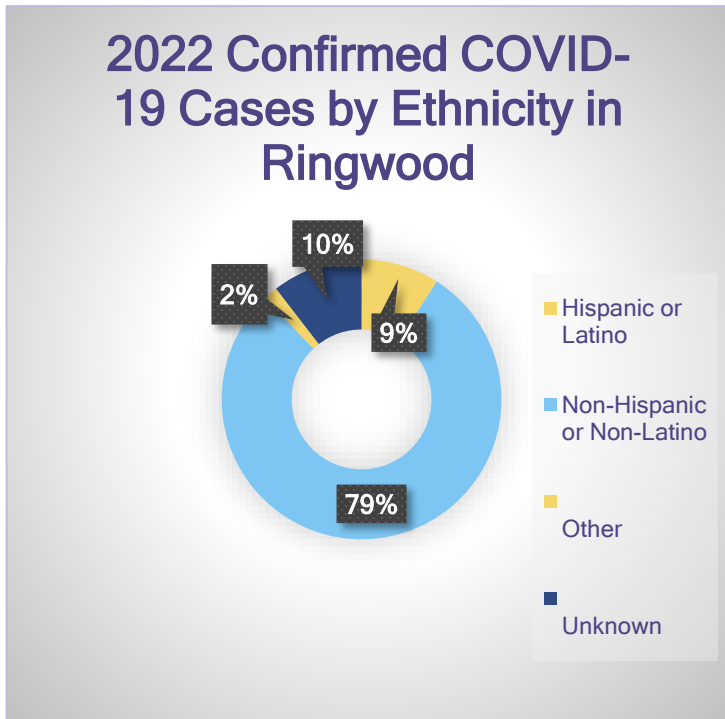
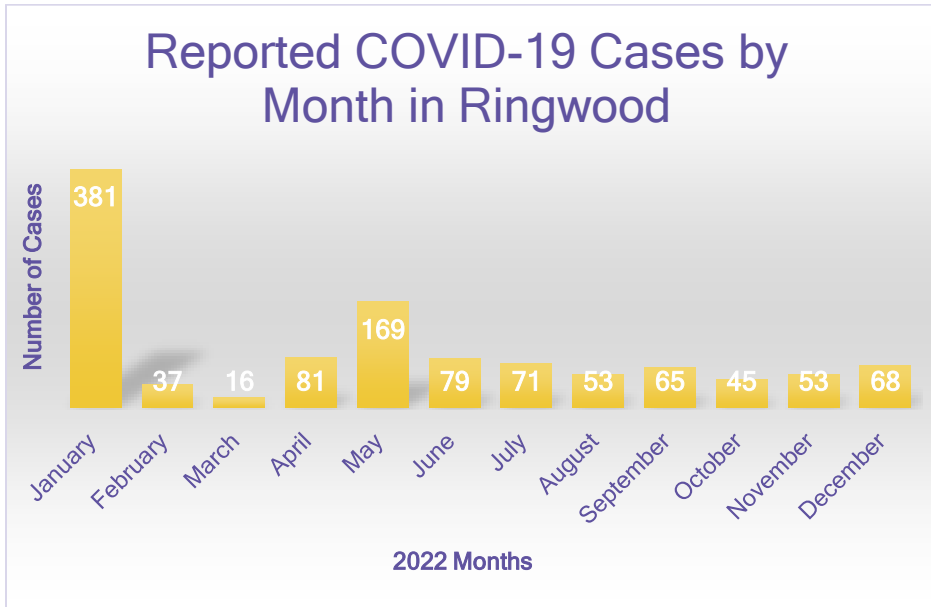


As the COVID-19 Pandemic is still a topic of conversation with new variants of interest on the rise, the Ringwood Health Department is actively working towards mitigation efforts. The Health Department has been diligently keeping up on new COVID-19 cases through an electronic reporting system called CommCare. This system allows for new cases to be populated specifically for the jurisdiction necessary; and ability to contact the positive case immediately to complete a case investigation.

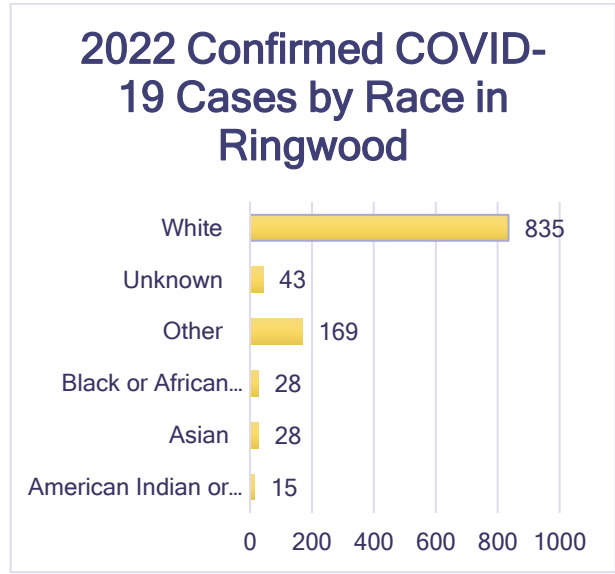
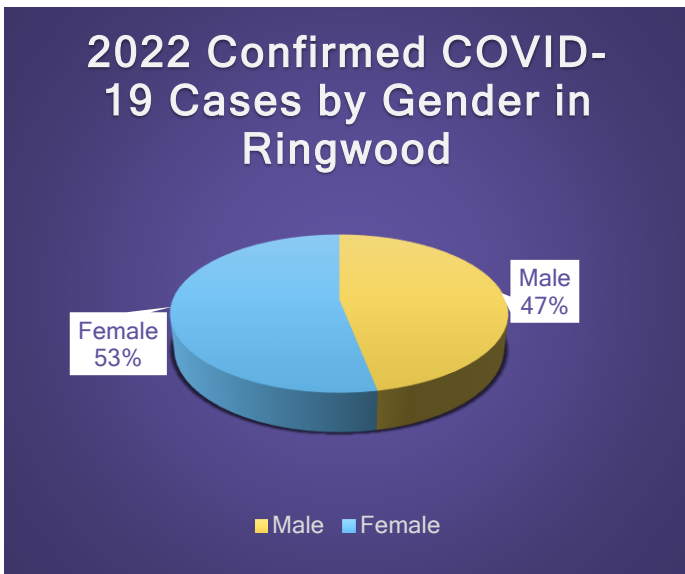
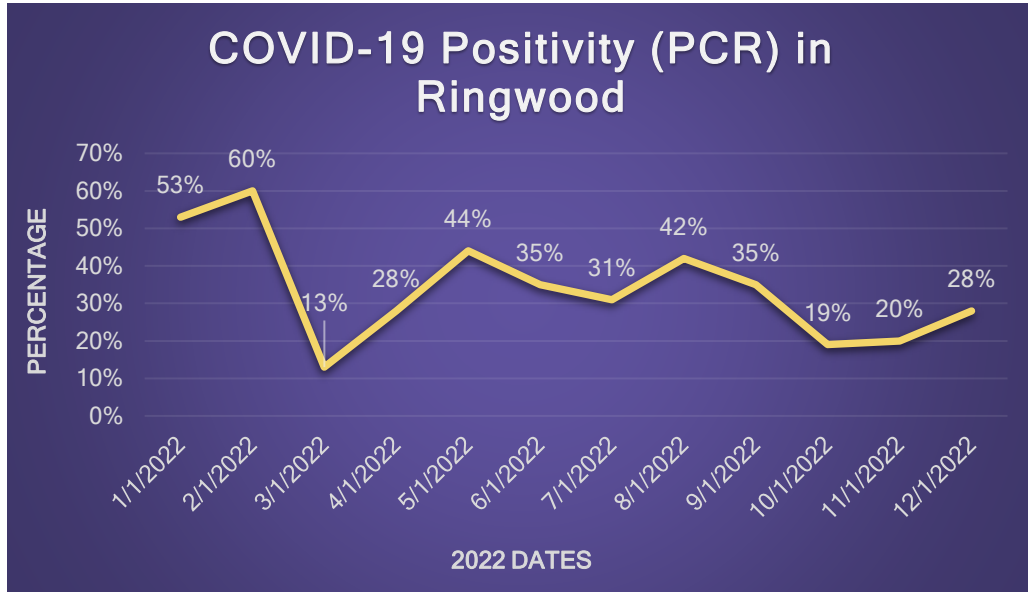
The Ringwood School District along with the local facility for developmentally disabled adults, Spectrum for Living, continued to update the Health Department regularly with any infectious disease outbreaks and sought out for guidance on isolation and quarantine. This open communication allowed for healthy relationships to build throughout the pandemic which helped to ensure a safer community.

Throughout the year, many efforts had been made on a global level to ease the spread of COVID-19. Two COVID-19 vaccine manufacturers, Pfizer and Moderna, had developed an updated bivalent booster. The updated boosters were called "bivalent" because they are created to protect against both the original SARS-CoV-2 virus that causes COVID-19 and the Omicron variants: BA.4 & BA.5. Research suggests that the updated bivalent booster provided more protection against the Omicron variant compared to the monovalent vaccination.

GRANTS: Strengthening Local Public Health Capacity

A new grant was awarded to the Ringwood Health Department in June of 2022. The grant, Strengthening Local Public Health Capacity, is funded by the New Jersey Department of Health and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. This grant allowed for the health department to onboard a new position for a year, an Infectious Disease Preparedness Generalist, IDPG. The Ringwood Health Department made a professional agreement with the Centers for Family Resources; this agreement granted access to work with a full time and part time person from the Highlands Success Center. This job title is known as Local Health Outreach Coordinator, LHOC. The LHOC and IDPG duties began with conducting interviews with members of the community referred to as 'key informants' to complete a health risk needs assessment. This health risk needs assessment was an evaluation of the community and seeking out residents who were disproportionately impacted by COVID-19, influenza or Lyme Disease. The IDPG & LHOC reviewed the information found in the assessment and planned programs to mend the gaps within the community. In the fall, the Ringwood Health Department presented the first annual 'Say Boo to the Flu' hike at a local trail. Community members gathered on a beautiful fall day and hiked while receiving educational information about influenza. Prior to Thanksgiving, the IDPG & LHOC's collaborated with the Passaic County Health Department and presented a 'Turkey Stroll' for residents to walk off their future Thanksgiving Day meals at the new Hewitt Walking Path. In December, the Local Health Outreach Coordinators ran a 'Pop-Up Coat Boutique.' Community members came to the local church and dropped off new or lightly used coats and then the next day the Coat Boutique was open! The donations were overwhelming. Those in need were able to come to the church and pick out any coats needed for themselves or their families. The remainder of the coats were donated to Ukraine. These programs are just a few of the beneficial ways to incorporate education on these prominent health topics while allowing the community members to learn about the new roles granted to the Health Department. STIGMA-FREE INITIATIVE

The Borough of Ringwood was awarded a grant in 2019 from Chilton Medical Center to raise awareness and advertise valuable resources about Stigma-Free. The Stigma-Free initiative aims to reduce the stigma associated with mental health conditions and substance use disorders. Individuals who are struggling with these disorders often do not seek treatment because of the shame they feel from themselves and others. By educating our community, people will seek the treatment they deserve. We hope to mobilize family, friends, and neighbors to offer compassion and support.



In April of 2022, the Ringwood Health Department, in collaboration with Caldwell University Community Nursing Students, provided a program to the fifth-grade students in Ringwood called "Flying Back to Normal," explaining the importance of mental health and well-being. The program was created to teach about different methods of coping and finding a safe space to fly away from different stigmas toward mental health. According to the Mental Health Association, the monarch butterfly represents mental health. The development of the butterfly was used to demonstrate the steps of flying away from stigma. The egg represents isolation and withdrawal from others; a caterpillar represents inching towards positivity and developing new coping techniques such as speaking with family and friends; a cocoon represents self-growth and harvesting, working to become the best version of oneself. The students enjoyed this program and learned different ways to cope with different stressors in a healthier way.



HEALTH EDUCATION AND PROMOTION

Health Education is provided under the guidance of the Public Health Nurse Supervisor. Programs and screenings are provided by the Ringwood Health Department, Atlantic Health System's Corporate Health, and in collaboration with partners such as the Ringwood Public Library, William Paterson University, and Montclair State University.

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING

Public Health Nursing is the practice of promoting and protecting the health of populations using knowledge from nursing, social, and public health sciences. The Public Health Nurse Supervisor coordinates and provides services for all age groups in Ringwood. These services include health screenings, well-child check-ups, pediatric and adult immunizations, school immunization audits, communicable disease investigations, home visits to vulnerable individuals, and emergency preparedness. A board-certified Pediatrician provides services for the Child Health Clinic, and per diem public health nurses and other health professionals aid the Public Health Supervisor in many screenings and clinics. This year we were excited to move into a new space for our clinics, as seen in the photo below.

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Environmental health is the branch of public health concerned with monitoring or mitigating those factors in the environment that affect human health and disease. All aspects of the natural and built environment are monitored by a Registered Environmental Health Specialist (REHS) that has gone through extensive training and licensure. Timely inspections of retail food establishments, septic systems, lakes, camps, and public health nuisances are conducted. Local and state regulations, such as Chapter 24 (N.J.A.C. 8:24) “*Sanitation in Retail Food Establishments and Food and Beverage Vending Machines*” are enforced. Environmental stewardship through education and grant activities help to maintain the pristine beauty of the New Jersey Highlands Region.

Healthy Lakes Campaign



One of the many great things Ringwood has to offer is our beautiful lakes. To ensure our lakes stay healthy for our residents, visitors, and wildlife the health department began an awareness campaign. We began with launching a website where residents can find resources on how they can protect our waterbodies with proper septic and lawn maintenance. To help find the website we sent out postcards directing residents to the website and reminding them to pump their septic tanks.

Ads were placed on Facebook and Instagram from July through August. We were able to reach 80% of the audience targeted in our social media efforts.

At the end of the campaign in August we saw a 54% increase in pumping compared to the year prior. We look forward to continuing and expanding the campaign on 2023.

ANIMAL CONTROL

Animal Control Services are provided through a shared services agreement with the Borough of Bloomingdale. With the oversight of the Animal Control Officer (ACO), Lisa Perry, and her staff, they provide compassionate and competent services for domestic pets and wildlife. Services include support with animal licensing, canvassing and enforcement; rabies control through rabies vaccine clinics, enforcement of state and local laws, and investigation of suspected cases of rabies; responding to calls about strays or animals in distress; and all other requests related to animals. An annual free rabies clinic is held each year in November to vaccinate dogs and cats. Annual licensure of dogs/cats is required each year by January 31st.
