New Jersey's Sanitary Code-*NJAC Chapter 24*, defines a *Retail Food Establishment* as "an operation that stores, prepares, packages, serves, vends or otherwise provides food for human consumption."

Local Health Departments are required to enforce New Jersey's Sanitary Code to ensure each establishment complies with *Chapter 24* requirements and standards for food establishments.

Chapter 24 delineates an establishment by its Risk Type*:

*Risk Type: Level of food preparation

Type 1- sells prepackaged food only, non-potentially hazardous food only

Type 2- limited menu, prepare, cook and serve product immediately

Type 3- extensive menu, handling of raw ingredients

Type 4- establishment conducts specialized processes

Chapter 24 requires food establishments to be inspected, at a minimum, once a year. Upon inspection, the establishment is evaluated and given a *Rating**.

**Rating Evaluation: (Placard with rating is to be posted for public view)

"Satisfactory"- establishment is operating in substantial compliance

"Conditionally Satisfactory"- operating in compliance with 1 or more violations

"Unsatisfactory"- one or more violations that constitute gross unsanitary or unsafe conditions

Ringwood has Thirty (30) Retail Food Establishments.

As of this month, <u>All Retail Food Establishments</u> in Ringwood have been inspected at least twice. <u>All</u> the establishments were given a <u>Satisfactory</u> Rating.
