Message From Mayor Jaime Matteo-Landis

As a resident of the Borough of Ringwood, I am writing to urge your immediate support for **Highlands Impact Aid** and a total revision of how school funding is allocated to Highland's preservation communities. We are partnering with Highland's communities like Jefferson and West Milford to demand justice. Please sign the form to show your support. For over two decades, Ringwood and other Highland's communities have shouldered the strictest land-use restrictions in New Jersey to protect the drinking water for millions of residents across the state. We take this responsibility seriously, but we are doing it at the direct expense of our local taxpayers. Because we are restricted from developing our land, we cannot grow our tax base. Despite this, the State has failed to deliver the "Impact Aid" and dedicated funding sources promised when the Highlands Act was enacted. This has created an unsustainable financial environment where our property taxes rise while our school aid is cut.

We are asking for the State of New Jersey's commitment to:

- Establish a permanent Highlands Impact Aid fund to compensate for lost opportunities to create rateables.
- Fix the School Funding Formula to recognize the unique geographic and logistical challenges of Highlands districts.
- Implement the "Water User Fee" originally outlined in the Highlands Master Plan to ensure those who benefit from our water help pay for its protection. The Highland's communities protect the water for 70% of New Jersey. It is time for New Jersey to protect the residents of Ringwood and neighboring communities. We can no longer carry this burden alone.

Betcha didn't know . . .

T Tree removal companies are required to be licensed by the State, and a tree removal permit must be approved by the Borough before any removal can occur. Yes, even if the tree is dead.

T When selecting your contractor, trust your gut. Get the license number up front, and be sure that a permit has been obtained – you can check by calling or emailing the Building Department.

Replacing your A/C air handler and condenser requires a permit. The condenser needs to conform to the zoning setbacks, so have your survey handy to give to your contractor.

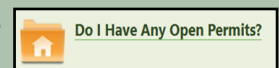

Did you know that as a homeowner, you are responsible for maintaining your septic system? Maintaining your septic system protects your investment in your home. You should periodically inspect your system and pump out your septic tank.

TOP 4 THINGS YOU CAN DO TO PROTECT YOUR SEPTIC SYSTEM:

1. Inspect and pump out your system every three years.
2. Use water efficiently.
3. Don't dispose of non-biodegradable items or household hazardous wastes in sinks or toilets.
1. Care for your drain field.

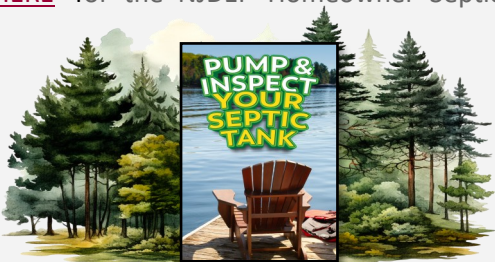

Tick Prevention Tips

Warmer weather means ticks are out and about more. Here are some ways to help protect yourself.

- Use repellent that contains 20 percent or more DEET, picaridin, or IR3535 on exposed skin for protection that lasts several hours. Use products that contain permethrin to treat clothing and gear, such as boots, pants, socks and tents or look for clothing pre-treated with permethrin. Treat dogs for ticks.

-Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants tucked into socks to seal gaps. Opt for light-colored clothing to spot ticks easily

- Avoid walking through high grass, brush, and leaf litter.

- Shower immediately after returning indoors. Put clothes in the dryer on high heat for 10–15 minutes to kill ticks.

- Clear tall grass, brush, and leaf litter around the home. Keep lawns mowed frequently.

- Create a 3-foot wide barrier of wood chips or gravel between lawns and wooded areas to restrict tick migration.

- Use veterinarian-approved tick prevention products on pets and check them daily, as they can carry ticks into the home.

- Perform full-body checks for nymphs (size of a poppy seed) and adults, especially in hotspots: underarms, behind knees, in hair, and around the waist.

- Use fine-tipped tweezers to grasp the tick firmly at the head and pull straight out. Do not use petroleum jelly or match tricks.

- Watch for fever, rash, or fatigue in the two weeks following a bite, and contact a doctor if symptoms arise.

Fire Inspection Application Changes

Mail or bring your application to the Fire Prevention Dept., along with the applicable fee in exact cash or check payable to the "Borough of Ringwood".

Lithium Battery Disposal

- Do not put lithium-ion batteries in the trash.
- Recycling is always the best option.
- Take them to a battery recycling location. [CLICK HERE](#) for PC Hazardous Waste Events.
- Do not put discarded batteries in piles.

Secondary Power Source Notification

If you have a fixed generator, solar panels, or a battery back-up system for your home, you should put a sticker on your electrical panel and near the electrical meter outside of your home to alert firefighters and electrical workers that even if the electric to the house is shut off, it could still be energized by secondary power. Simple warning stickers are available from Amazon and other popular retailers. If you are selling your home, these stickers are now a requirement under the New Jersey Fire Code, and are necessary to pass inspection.

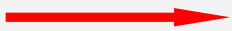

Odd/Even Water Days

As per Ordinance 18-15.3 the Borough requires residents to follow an odd/even day watering schedule. If your house number is an even number (i.e. #10), you water on even number days (i.e. June 4th). If your house number is an odd number (i.e. #3), you water on odd number days (i.e. June 5th).

Please refrain from watering during the hours of 10am and 6pm when water loss is greatest.

Water and Sewer Payments

Water and Sewer payments must be made payable to RINGWOOD WATER DEPARTMENT. For billing questions, please call (973) 475-7116.

There is a secure drop box by the front door of Borough Hall for payments that is available 24 hours a day/seven days a week, if you wish to drop off your payment. No cash payments can be put in the drop box.

Final readings for water should be called in in advance of the closing date in order to allow enough time for the reading to be properly scheduled. **Call (973) 475-7116 to schedule.**

Spring Hydrant Flushing is Complete

We would like to thank our residents for your patience during our spring hydrant flushing. The work has been completed. Hydrant flushing is important to the general maintenance of Borough's water system. Regular inspection and testing of fire hydrants and flushing the hydrants is required for compliance with the New Jersey Water Quality Accountability Act and ensures adequate water flow is available to residents, businesses, and firefighters. It also helps maintain water quality by clearing iron and other mineral deposits from the water distribution mains. Hydrant flushing helps ensure water quality and reduces the occurrence of rusty water during periods of high-water demand, such as a major firefighting effort or high usage during a sustained drought.

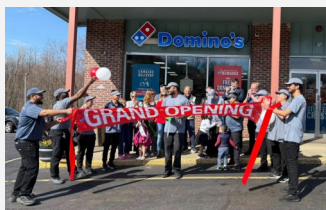

Tips for Keeping Bears Out of Your Garbage

Here are some tips to keep them out of your trash.

- All garbage must be stored in airtight containers
- Wash these containers at least once a week with a disinfectant solution to remove any odors

- Do not store garbage cans against the doors of the garage, basement or wooden shed
- Keep garbage inside the secure area until the morning of collection

Stay NJ benefits are calculated after ANCHOR and Senior Freeze benefits are determined. If you qualify for all three programs, the Stay NJ benefit will be 50% of your property taxes (up to \$13,000) minus any payments received through ANCHOR and Senior Freeze (2025 benefit cap of \$6,500).
